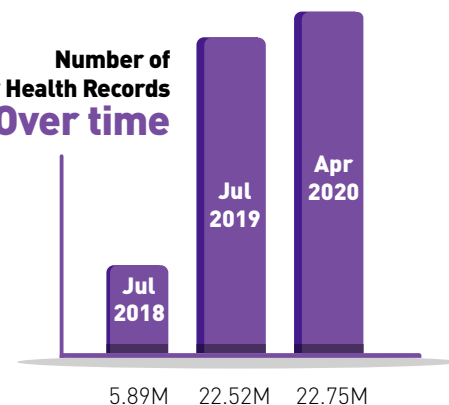
The Big Picture

22.75M Total My Health Records

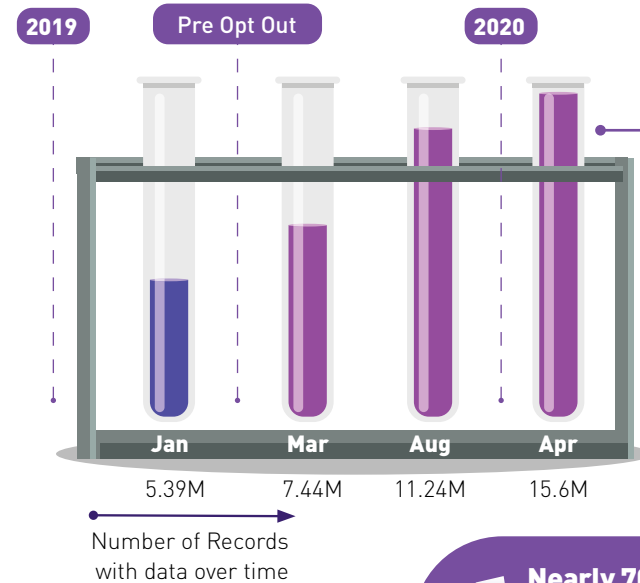
When you have a My Health Record your health information can be viewed securely online from anywhere, at any time - even if you move or travel interstate. You and your healthcare providers can also access your health information from any computer or device that's connected to the internet.

An increase of 230,000 records since July 2019.

Number of My Health Records Over time

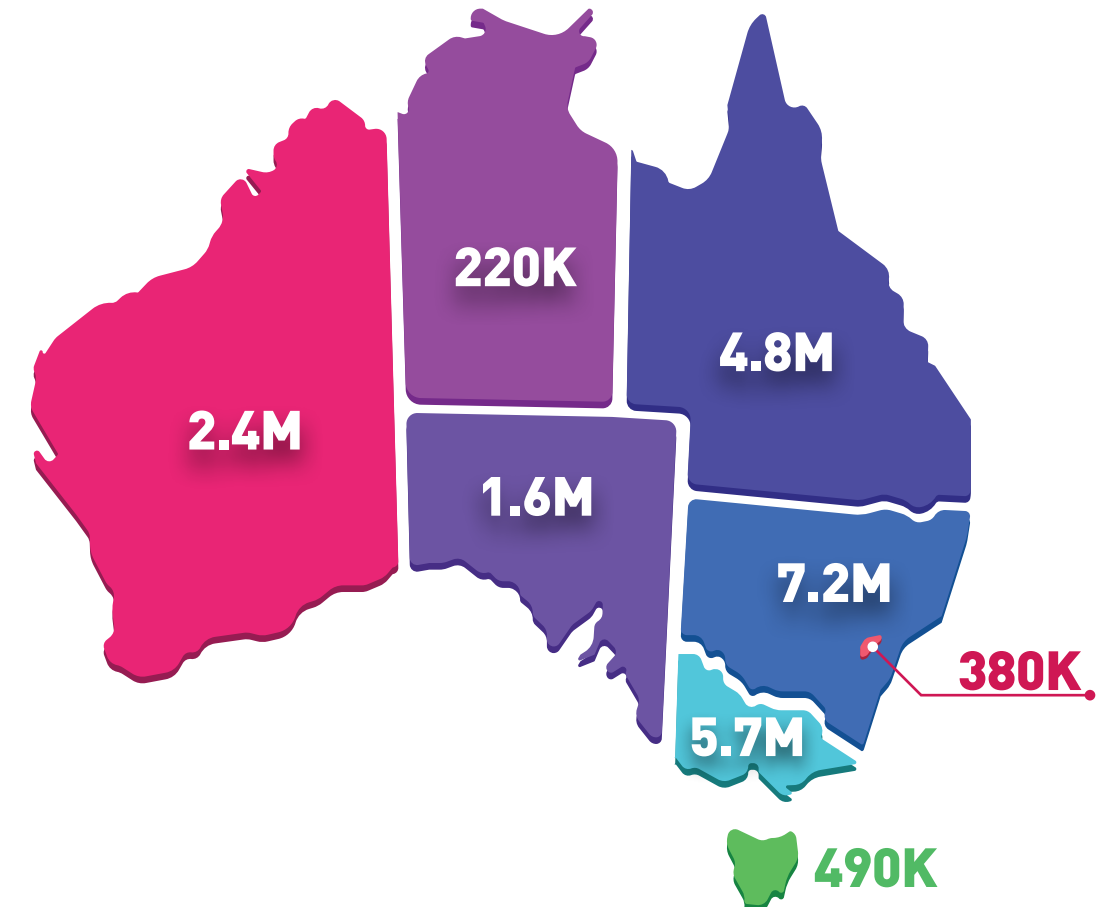


Over 15.6M records now have data in them

What's inside?

1.95B Documents uploaded to My Health Record

From medical histories to the latest blood tests, from pathology reports to advanced care plans, more vital health information is now securely stored and available when needed.



There are 190M documents in the system that have been uploaded by consumers or healthcare providers.

Over 65M Clinical Documents

Documents uploaded by a healthcare provider like hospitals, pathologists and radiologists.



An increase of nearly 3.5 million documents in April alone.

Over 128M Medicine Documents

Documents uploaded by healthcare providers like pharmacies and GPs.



An increase of more than 6M documents in April alone

+ 1.76B Medicare Documents

Documents uploaded by government agencies like Services Australia and Veterans' Affairs.

+ 304K Consumer Documents

Key Insight

There has been an increase of more than 10% of all records with data in them from March to April and a recent survey of healthcare providers showed that for 25% of them it prevented a medicine error.

It's important to remember **not to put your health on hold**. Doctors, nurses and mental health professionals can now deliver Medicare-subsidised services via telehealth to all Australians.

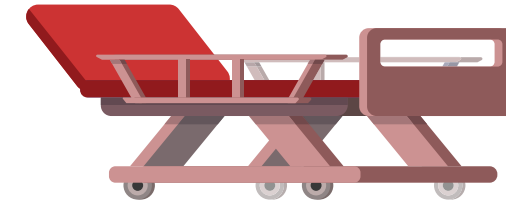

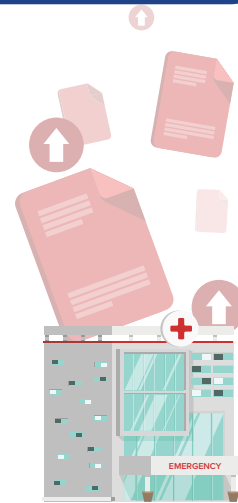

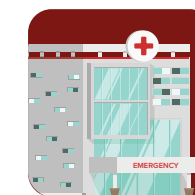
How many documents are in the system now?

How have healthcare provider views and uploads changed over time



Healthcare providers viewed nearly
65,000

That's an increase of more than **280%** compared to April last year.



Key Insight

Retail pharmacies and GP's are now the biggest healthcare provider contributors of documents to the system whereas GP's and Public Hospitals & Health Services view the most documents.
