

# Accessing the Medicines Information View

*Note: These steps assume that your software is connected to the My Health Record system, the patient has a My Health Record and their individual healthcare identifier (IHI) has been validated in your system*

## Option 1: for users of Genie via the NASH approach


### STEP 1:

In the patient's clinical record, click the **My Health Record icon** to gain access, then select the **My Health Record tab**.



### STEP 2:

Click **View Document List** to refresh the list. Then double-click to open the **Medicines View**.



### STEP 3:


The **Medicines View** will display available medicines and allergy information held in a patient's My Health Record with the **Allergies and Adverse Reactions tab** displayed by default.



**STEP 4:**  
To view a patient's medicines information, click on the **Medicines Preview**.

By default, the medicines information is sorted by date. To sort the medicines by active ingredient, click on **Medicine – Active Ingredient(s)**.

You can click on any hyperlinks within the list of medicines to view the original source document (e.g. Discharge Summary or Event Summary).




**Option 2:** for users of Genie v9.4.1 or later and registered under the Genie Solutions CSP approach

**STEP 1:**  
Open the patient's clinical file then click on the **My Health Record** icon.

**STEP 2:**  
A separate browser window will launch with the patient's My Health Record in view. You will be shown the **Health Record Overview page** by default.

Use the **Medicines tab** to find the Medicines View.
