


Uploading an Event Summary


Note:

- a) These steps assume that your software is connected to the My Health Record system, the patient's Individual Healthcare Identifier (IHI) has been validated in your system, and the patient has a My Health Record.
- b) My Health Record was previously known as the Personally Controlled Electronic Health Record (PCEHR). PCEHR still appears in Medtech software.
- Once you have opened the patient's local medical record and entered the clinical information/notes for the consultation, select the PCEHR tab, then select Create and Send eHealth Document.




 In the Document tab, select Event
Summary, then tick/untick the
Consultation Notes to include/not include in the Event Summary.

You can also manually enter the clinical synopsis via the **Notes** tah



3. Review the information in the Medical Warnings, Medication, Classifications, and Immunisation tabs and tick/untick the items to include/not include in the Event Summary.

In this example, the **Immunisation** tab is shown.








4. In the **Preview** tab, review the Event Summary to verify it has populated correctly.

Attest to the statements at the bottom of screen, then select **Pack and Send** (bottom-right corner) to upload the Event Summary to the patient's My Health Record.

Note: The Personally Controlled Electronic Health Records Act 2012 (referred to in the attestations) has been superseded by the My Health Records Act 2012.



5. The Event Summary will also save to the patient's local medical record in the **Patient Outbox**.
